The Arts in Every Classroom: A Workshop for Elementary Teachers

This video workshop provides new ideas about working with the arts for K-5 classroom and arts specialist teachers. The eight one-hour video programs show teachers, principals, and arts specialists from three elementary schools work through a curriculum unit based on a multi-arts performance piece by Cirque du Soleil. Classroom segments show schoolchildren engaged in the same lessons. Learner Team members then begin to design their own arts-based units, and return to their schools to put into practice what they learned.

Dogs and More Dogs

From the huskies of the frozen north to the basenjis of the Congo River basin and the golden retrievers in America's backyards, dogs have carved a niche for themselves in every human society.

How did this unique relationship develop? What can the latest breakthroughs in genetics reveal about dog origins and breeding? And can dog sociologists and psychiatrists unravel the puzzling, lovable and often maddening quirks of dog behavior?

Despite wide variation, all domestic dogs, as well as their common ancestor, the gray wolf, have virtually identical genes. How can science explain this incredible diversity? NOVA visits state-of-the-art dog labs where the latest developments in genetic mapping and even cloning are in the air. Along the way, breeders and dog experts, as well as scientists, help explore the bond people share with these remarkable animals, seeking insights into the future of mankind's oldest and closest relationship with another animal species.

The Persuaders

FRONTLINE takes an in-depth look at the multibillion-dollar "persuasion industries" of advertising and public relations. To cut through mass-media clutter and to overcome consumers' growing resistance to their pitches, marketers



have developed new ways of integrating their messages deeper into the fabric of our lives. Through sophisticated market research methods to better understand consumers and by turning to the little-understood techniques of public relations to make sure their messages come from sources we trust, marketers are crafting messages that resonate with an increasingly cynical public.

In this 90-minute documentary essay, correspondent Douglas Rushkoff (NYU professor and correspondent for FRONTLINE's "The Merchants of Cool") also explores how the culture of marketing has come to shape the way Americans understand the world and themselves and how the techniques of the persuasion industries have migrated to politics, shaping the way our leaders formulate policy, influence public opinion, make decisions and stay in power.

Just One Night

February 17, 1994, started out as a good day for Tom Boyle. A middle-class family man, successful in business, Boyle was on the verge of making a multimillion dollar deal for his company and was looking forward to going home the next day to his family



in Vermont. At the end of the day, Boyle shared drinks with friends, and later, a few more with some strangers he met in a Concord, New Hampshire, bar. That's the last thing Boyle remembers about that night. His next memory is of being rolled along on a hospital gurney as a state trooper informed him that he had just killed the passenger in his car after driving into a snowplow at 100 miles per hour.
