

At the center of a baseball is a grape-sized cork called a "pill." The pill is surrounded by two rubber covers, one black, and one red. These have too much bounce for a baseball. To cushion the bounce. this core is wrapped with lots and lots of yarn: 121 yards of 4-ply gray wool varn. 45 yards of 3-ply white wool, 53 yards of 3-ply

gray wool and wrapped around all of that, 150 yards of cotton yarn. Finally, cowhide leather covers the ball and it's sewn together with 108 stitches of red cotton.
